

## A Place at the Table

A Place at the Table (APATT) is a pay-what-you-can café. This café's mission is to provide community and healthy food for all regardless of means. While service had to be limited to take-out during COVID, the café is now open again for indoor and outdoor dining! When ordering meals, you can pay the suggested donation or pay more for your meal to pay-it-forward, APATT has also expanded their space and menu to serve more people! 50-70 people can dine inside and 20 or so can dine outside. The restaurant is located at 300 W. Hargett Street in downtown Raleigh and is open 8am – 2pm Tuesday- Sunday.

SAPC Advocate Sherry Hay says, "The café is here for all of us, building community and providing healthy food for all, regardless of means."

#### How A Place at the Table will use your donation:

\$5 coffee for two

\$10 meal

\$15 t-shirt for a meal volunteer (someone who cannot afford a tshirt)

## **BackPack Buddies**

BackPack Buddies is part of the Interfaith food Shuttle (IFFS). Since 1989, IFFS programs have helped stamp out hunger in the 7 greater triangle area counties. The BackPack program delivers enough food to students for the weekend. Some of these students are homeless or their families just need a little extra helpl

SAPC Advocate Kitty Burlington says, "Again, this year has been different due to COVID restrictions at the church and at WCPSS schools. We have temporarily suspended the program at the church until we can collect, pack and deliver food to River Bend Elementary as we have done in the past years. In lieu of this, our church has donated money to the BackPack Program to help support 20 boxes of prepackaged food that are delivered to River Bend Elementary each week. Please know that your donations will help feed children in Wake County. Thank you for your support over the years. It is still needed this year."

\$150 supplies a door for a home

#### How Haiti Reforestation Project will use your donation:

- \$15 purchases school supplies
- \$20 buys hoes, shovels, machetes to prepare the land for planting
- \$25 plants 100 forest, fruit, and coffee trees
- \$30 secures water treatment tablets for safe drinking water
- \$50 sends a child to primary school for a year
- \$100 sends a child to secondary school for a year
- \$200 buys a ton of fertilizer for gardens and new forest seedling

#### Loaves & Fishes

Loaves and Fishes (LAF) empowers low-income K-12 youth and their families to overcome individual challenges in order to achieve healthier and more fulfilling lives. Sustaining these programs for more than 30 years, LAF provides positive intervention to more than 50 children and 125 family members.

Joe Burmester, Director of LAF, notes "I have watched many of these children grow and thrive with the support and love of the LAF family. These are bright children who just need a little TLC to help them bloom where they have been planted.

Valerie Hubard, who coordinates the SAPC Angel Tree Project for LAF, loves that this mission supports a program that helps children in our own community. "When I was a teacher for WCPSS, I saw so many kids that were in tough situations from no fault of their own. Programs like this offer help and hope for a better future."



#### How LAF will use your donation:

\$15 buys school supplies for a semester for a child

\$50 buys thumb drives for 10 students to support their homework requirements

\$100 supports 15 students with an outing at a museum or play

\$125 provides healthy snacks for all students for a week

\$250 keeps the buses running for a month's transportation to and from school

#### Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels (MOW) provides nutritious meals to the homebound elderly and persons with disabilities in order to improve health, reduce isolation, and prevent inappropriate institutionalization. Following adjustments made due to COVID, MOW has resumed providing a warm, nutritious meal Monday through Friday either delivered at home from 12 volunteer pickup locations (including Saint Andrews) or served at one of the eight Friendship Cafes where seniors can have noon meals and socialize with friends. MOW currently serves 1,400 elderly and homebound clients in Wake County. Volunteers to deliver meals are always needed.

SAPC Advocate Tom Cogswell says, "I have been delivering meals for Meals on Wheels for many years, and it has been very rewarding to see the gratitude of the people who are served. We need to make sure that these deserving people continue to receive the help that Meals on Wheels provides."



#### How MOW will use your donation:

- \$20 provides meals for one person for one week
- \$35 provides food warmers so that meals are delivered warm
- \$50 buys gasoline gift cards for Meals on Wheels volunteers
- \$80 secures one month of meals for a senior neighbor

# North Raleigh Ministries

North Raleigh Ministries (NRM) envisions a vibrant, healthy community where each person reaches their full potential. They work toward this by equipping families and individuals in crisis with the resources and skills they need to achieve stability through the Food Pantry, Guidance & Prayer, and the Journey Program. NRM walks alongside their clients and moves them from crisis to a thriving life built on a firm foundation of spiritual, mental and financial health.

SAPC representative Karen Weber says "I have volunteered at North Raleigh Ministries for six years in the thrift shop and two years ago I started working in the food pantry. My work there has been so rewarding that I recently volunteered to assist with the Journey program. It's special to be able to work on both sides of the organization: to greet the shoppers and help them with their purchases and then to see the new programming to help our neighbors in need."

Saint Andrews has graciously extended its financial and hands-on support in partnership with St. Philip Lutheran Church on the second and fourth Saturday mornings each month. Volunteers gather to pack and deliver over 500 lunches as well as diapers to refugee families at Cedar Point Apartments.

# Rise Against Hunger

Rise Against Hunger (RAH) is driven by the vision of a world without hunger. Driving RAH's work is the recognition that ending hunger is more than just feeding people. This has led RAH to focus its feeding programs in areas where they can have a real impact and expand their hunger-fighting programs beyond meal packaging and distribution. RAH is based in Raleigh but operates meal packaging programs worldwide. In 2020, 2.8 million lives were impacted by RAH meals and other assistance in 78 countries. At Saint Andrews, we have been packaging over 20,000 meals each year. Next year, with you help we can surpass 100,000 meals packed since we began partnering with RAH. Each meal costs about 34 cents. Therefore, the more volunteers and financial support, the more meals we can pack.

SAPC representative for Rise Against Hunger, Elizabeth Lusk, says, "Since our first packaging event in 2015 when we packed 10,000 meals, we have packaged more than 94,000 meals. This intergenerational event has been well-attended. God is truly working among us, inspiring and energizing the church through our families, youth and individual church members"

- Loaves and Fishes and Refugee Ministries is providing children with homework help.


